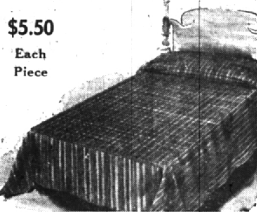

Cranbrook Exhibit Honors Eliel Saarinen, Architect

Sunday marked the opening of the Eliel Saarinen Memorial exhibition at the Cranbrook Academy of Arts, one of the buildings designed by the noted Finnish-American architect and city planner.

The display brings together a collection of drawings, plans, models, sketches and photographs, covering almost 50 years of his work. Planned by Eva Ingersoll Gattling, museum curator, with Loja and Eero Saarinen and Wilhelm von Moltke, a member of the Saarinen firm, the display will be open until May 6.

After the closing date, the 23 photographic panels will be sent out on a nation-wide tour. The display includes drawings of his studio-home near Helsinki, Finland, two country estates and the dining room from the Cranbrook residence which was built in 1929.

MR. SAARINEN'S first noted architectural achievement, the Helsinki railroad station, is shown in drawings, plans and pictures. It was from his experiences here which pointed up the relationship of architecture to society, that he became so deeply interested in city planning.

Displays of his work for Greater Helsinki, at Canberra, Australia and Ivalo, Estonia, will be to compare his later plans for American industrial centers.

Mr. Saarinen became known in the United States in 1922 through the Chicago Tribune tower competition, in which his second place design attracted national attention.

Invited to the University of Virginia as guest professor in 1923, Mr. Saarinen became acquainted with the late George G. Booth, Cranbrook founder, and was engaged by him to design the educational center he planned. These buildings represent the architect's first monumental work in this country.

PROMINENT in the exhibit will be recent collaborative work of Eliel Saarinen and his son Eero. These will include prominent schools, churches and public buildings throughout the country.

An open forum is also planned. Reservations for the meeting and noon luncheon should be made through the Social Agencies office, 307 W. Sixth, Royal Oak.

Hike Reflected In Southfield School Budget

A \$752,136 operating budget for 1951-52 was sent back to the county allocation board by the Southfield Township school board this week. This figure is an \$88,293 increase over the \$663,843 which is expected to be spent during the 1950-51 school year.

Superintendent Glenn Schoenhals stated that the increase is caused by additional staff members needed in the elementary and high school grades, and greater amount of books and instructional supplies.

TENTH GRADE students are expected to be accommodated in the new high school this fall.

Increases in appropriations were listed for general control, instruction, auxiliary and coordinate activities, operation of plant, and maintenance.

Decreases were listed for fixed charges and capital outlay.

Schoenhals said these were caused by a revamped insurance program.

Revenues are expected from the following sources: state primary, \$81,960; state aid, \$191,448; sales tax, \$122,940; state tuition, \$49,148; current tax collections, \$251,820; and delinquent tax collections, \$44,900.

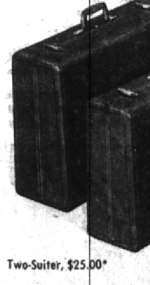
