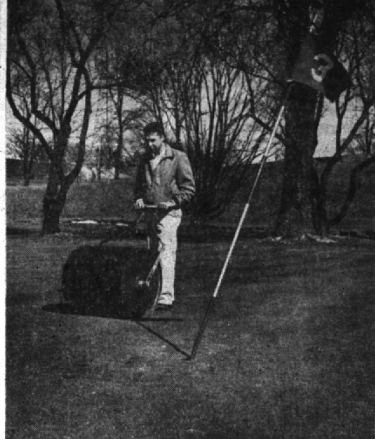

**Troy Twp. School Board Submits \$341.80 Budget**

A \$341,870 operating budget for 1951-52 was submitted by the Troy township school board to the county tax allocation board Monday.

This figure shows a \$28,970 increase over that of a year ago. The reason for the hike has been attributed to the operation of the new high school which opens this fall.

**AMONG THE DEPARTMENTS** showing a hike in appropriations are the following: instruction from \$192,180 to \$217,665; operation of plant, \$46,500 to \$51,900; auxiliary services, \$26,400 to \$27,350; and general control, \$21,420 to \$23,055.

Reductions in appropriations from the 1950-51 budget is as follows: fixed charges from \$5,400 to \$4,900; maintenance, \$10,500 to \$9,300; and capital outlay, \$14,500 to \$8,300.

Estimated revenue this year is \$344,650. There will be a balance of \$2,150.

Enrollment is estimated at 1200 for elementary grades and 650 for secondary classes.

The \$344,650 revenue will come from the following sources: estimated balance, June, 1951, \$10,000; estimated current taxes for 1951, \$49,000; delinquent tax for 1951, \$8,000; primary, \$47,340;

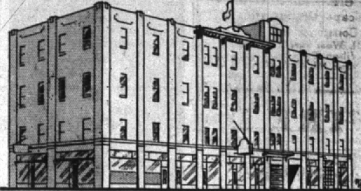
Before receiving his wings, he qualified in combat type planes aboard the USS Monterey.
