The Southfield township board at its April 24 meeting will consider entering into a contract with the South Oakland garbage authority.

This matter was considered at last week's meeting but was tabled until new Justice Glenn Hague has a chance to look over the articles of incorporation. Plans call for 30 municipalities of this area to join in the authority.

Also to be considered will be extension of water service into the new Indian Village subdivision in Beverly Hills. The board is seeking legal advice as to the financial possibility of extending the facilities.

Water Commissioner Leonard Lamb has stated that under present conditions no further extensions should be made in that area because of dwindling supplies.
