Remodelling Program Enlarges Facilities at Orchard Lake C. C.

When the members of the Orchard Lake Country club gather for the open house and the new member tea, Sunday, April 29, they will observe many changes in the appearance of the club house and surroundings.

A \$140,000 remodeling program has been taking place during the winter months, according to President John P. St. Clair, 1645 Fairfax, to accommodate the growing needs of the club.

THE LOUNGE AND upstairs rooms have been completely re-decorated. The grill room has been enlarged and maple paneling added.

The beach house has been practically doubled in size. The men's locker room is twice its former size, featured by maple paneling and has two large bay windows. It now has 500 lockers.

The pro-shop has been completely remodeled and a new entrance made. Professional Tom Shannon reports he now has about twice the space as previously.

St. Clair said the open house and tea will serve a double purpose this year. It will enable the new members to meet everyone and also allow the membership to inspect the entire facilities of the club.

HE ADDED THAT this Sunday will be the only opportunity the women members will have to view the men's locker rooms.

The only equipment was two tents for locker rooms and one tent on the beach for the use of the club sailors. A few years later the permanent clubhouse was erected.
