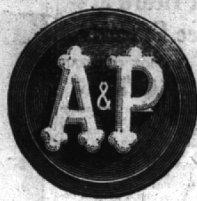

Local Artists Selected For Musicales Program

The Birmingham Musicales will present Elsie Moon, soprano, Alta Lynn Magor, pianist and Celia Merrill Turner, violinist when the organization meets April 12, at 2 o'clock at the Community House. Mrs. Magor and Mrs. Turner will play "Sonata in E Minor" by Veracini and "Sonata in A Minor" by Julius Chajes. Composer Chajes is director of music at the Jewish Community Center in Detroit.

Mrs. Moon will vary her part of the program with a group of Italian numbers and a group of spring songs, including "Fruhlingstraube" (Faith in Spring) by Franz Schubert and "Floods of Spring" by Sergei Rachmaninoff. She will be accompanied by Dorothy Gillon.

Mrs. Moon is a member of St. James Choir and The Madrigal Singers. She studied in New York and in Birmingham.

Mrs. Gillon studied at the Northwestern University School of Music.

A member of the Royal Oak and Birmingham Musicales, Mrs. Magor is a resident of Berkeley Hills and teaches there. She was graduated from the Conservatory of Music at Joliet, Illinois and continued her musical studies at the University of Illinois and privately.

Mrs. Turner is a former student of Michael Press at Michigan State College and studied for three years at the Juillard Graduate School in New York, where she had a fellowship in conducting. Later as a WAC she conducted the 401st Army Band for two seasons. She played the violin under Meredith Wilson in the Armed Forces radio service orchestra, and played one year with the Phoenix Symphony. She has recently become an authorized teacher of the Schilling system of composition. She and Mrs. Magor have been appearing as a sonata team for the past five years.
