New Series E Bond Law In Effect May 1

New provisions for the extension of Series E Bonds have recently been enacted into law by Congress, according to Delmar V. Cote, state director of the savings bond division of the treasury department.

Beginning May 1, holders are given the following choices in reference to maturing Series E bonds:

- (1) Accepting cash if desired.
- (2) Continuing to hold the bond, with an automatic interest extension. Owners who exercise this extension privilege will receive 2 1/2 percent simple interest for all or any part of the next 7 1/2 years; interest during the extension will bring the total interest to 2.9 percent compounded.
- (3) Exchange the matured bond for a current income savings bond of Series G.

HERBERT H. GARDNER, president of the Birmingham First National bank, said the new plan was formed to encourage the retention of the bonds. Formerly there was no provision for interest after 10 years, he pointed out.

A savings bond purchaser will receive 78 percent more than his original investment by holding his bond to maturity and then taking full advantage of his extension privilege for another 10 years. For instance, this means that a buyer could receive \$133.33 for the bond he originally purchased for \$75.

The treasury department has emphasized that full cash payment
