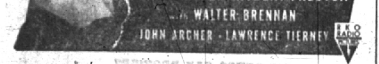

"Within minutes two officers arrived and put the arm in splints. They then took him to St. Joseph hospital in Pontiac. I followed with a friend in another car."

"These two officers remained with us till we were sure they weren't needed. After they were off duty they stopped on their way home and asked after the boy."

"WE, IN BIRMINGHAM, have come to expect much from our police force but the officers in this case went far beyond necessary courtesy and kindness."

"I'm sorry I did not get their names but you will know from their reports who they are and they are probably representative of your entire excellent department."

Thurston said Ronald's injury was received while he was playing with a neighborhood friend.

Spotting Bogus Bills Not Hard If You Know How

That \$10 or \$20 bill in your pocket may be just as valuable to you as a plugged nickel. You can't even sell the thing for scrap paper for fear that someone else will get hold of it.

In the past month or so many of these bogus bills have been passed in Detroit, although none have been reported so far in Birmingham.

AN INSPECTION of these imitations is enough to let you know you're not handling the McCoy. The majority of Federal Reserve Notes in this area are from Chicago with the letter G in the Reserve Bank seal.

William A. Carlson, special agent in charge of the Secret Service in Detroit said the "imposters" are \$10 bill from Dallas, bank letter K; \$20 bills from Dallas, bank letter K; Richmond, bank letter K; Minneapolis, bank letter I; and New York, bank letter B. He asks that anyone getting one of these bills notify Detroit Secret Service at once.

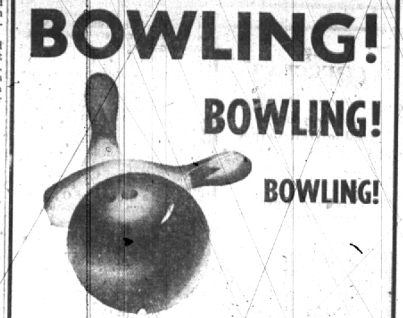
