Baptist Minister Visits Old Parish

Guests at the First Baptist Church were Dr. and Mrs. Joseph O. Nelson and their daughter, Alita. Their Birmingham visit was marked by a reception in the church parlor, arranged by the board of deacons.

The Rev. Emil Kontas conducted the opening devotional service after which the Nelsons were presented to the group. Mrs. Nelson, secretary for the Youth Council of the state of Iowa, spoke of her work with young people. She is also state secretary of the Japan International Christian university fund whose goal is to raise \$10,000,000 for a graduate Christian school in Japan.

Dr. Nelson reported on his extensive work with the Inter-Church Council of the state of Iowa, which is a national state organizations cooperative with over 640,000 church members.

RALPH DUNBAR

Ohio U. Cites Student Record Of Ralph Dunbar

ATHENS, Ohio — Graduating from the college of Arts and Sciences this month, Ralph Dunbar, son of Mrs. Dorothy E. Dunbar, 950 Chester, nears the completion of four outstanding years at Ohio university.

Dunbar's record has been exceptional since entering the university. He was named to the dean's list both semesters of his freshman year. He also served as an officer of Eta Sigma Phi, classical language honor society.

During his junior year Dunbar was elected vice president of the student body and served on the Men's Union planning, board and Student Council.

A GRADUATE of Roxboro junior high in Cleveland, and Baldwin high school, '47, Dunbar is one of the few university students to be named to its three military honor groups. He has been an officer in the Pershing Rifles, basic military honor society, president of Scalad and Blade, senior military honor society and was a charter member of the Arnold Air society.

In June he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the USAF and was cited by the military department as a distinguished student.

Serving as chairman of the military ball for two years, Dunbar is credited with having staged two successful events.

He is also a member of Delta Tau Delta, national fraternity. He led that group's glee club with the all-campus men's sing this year.
