## Progress Slow on New Southfield Twp. High School

Progress of the new Southfield township high school, Lahser and 10 Mile roads, is coming along slowly, according to Superintendent Glenn Schoenhals.

Unit B will be completed for the opening but the superintendent said it is doubtful that unit C will be finished, although parts of that unit will probably be ready.

Completed units A and B house a bus garage, class rooms, drawing room, home economics department, storage space, power plant and shops. The third unit will include laboratories, class rooms, library and administrative offices.

**PRELIMINARY PLANS** which Schoenhals emphasized may have to be changed, call for eighth, ninth and tenth grade students to use the new school this fall.

Only ninth graders were housed in the structure last term. McKinley school which provided for eighth grade students last year is slated to be used as an elementary school.

## Firm Considering Tot Lot Plan For New Subdivision

The Edward Rose Building Co., which recently purchased lots in Sheffield Estates, has submitted to the city commission plans and sketches for the re-subdivision of the area.

The lots form a triangle bounded by Eton, Sheffield and Melton streets. Included in the plans is a tot lot for use as a recreation area for children.

**PLANS AND SKETCHES** were referred to the recreation board for comments and suggestions.

The Rose firm stated it wished to equip the tot lot with necessary swings, slides, etc., so that it would be a complete recreation area for children. However, the company asked advice from the city as to current municipal thinking in the matter.

Troy township school board will again advertise for bids for the sale of the Log Cabin school athletic field.

Electors from the Log Cabin school district voted this spring for the school board to sell the field, with money received going toward development of a recreation area at the high school.
