William C. Ford To Head Torch Drive In Suburban Area

William C. Ford, youngest of the three Ford brothers, has been appointed chairman of the suburban unit for the 1951 United Foundation Torch Drive.

David S. Diamond, president of the Diamond Screw Products Co. of Wyandotte, will be co-chairman of the unit.

The third annual "Give Once for All" drive, which raises funds for 146 health and community service agencies, will be held from Oct. 16 to Nov. 9.

John S. Bugas, Ford Motor Co. vice-president in charge of industrial relations and general chairman of the drive, announced the appointment of Ford and Diamond Saturday.

A director of the Ford company and manager of the quality control department of the gas turbine plant of Lincoln-Mercury division's defense production operations, Ford is associated with the company's production of J-40 jet engines for the Navy.

In their posts with the Torch Drive, Ford and Diamond will supervise the organization, promotion and solicitation in the eight suburban regions of the campaign area.

Included in the suburban unit are the Downriver, Highland Park, Hamtramck, Dearborn, Southern Oakland, Warren Township, Birmingham-Bloomfield and Oakland areas.

A total of 6,000 workers will be under Ford and Diamond's direction.

Last year the suburban unit raised \$985,000 in the drive to which a total of \$10,404,000 was subscribed. The goal of the coming campaign has not been set as yet.
