Urges Roll Call Participation

Birmingham area residents who have lived in Detroit at any time of work there or "been a part of the town at any time," were issued an invitation this week by Edgar A. Guest, well known poet, to sign up for the Roll Call of Detroit.

The Roll Call, as Guest describes it, "will be a list of those who want to go on record as offering a birthday gift to Detroit for this 250th anniversary year in recognition of what Detroit has meant to them."

ADMISSION TO THE Roll Call list is earned by a contribution to Detroit's 250th birthday gift fund. The Roll Call of Detroit will be enclosed in the correspondence of the Convention Hall-Exhibits Building in the riverfront civic center and the Community Arts Building of Wayne University, the two projects of the Capital Gifts Committee of the 250th Birthday Festival.

"When a wealthy man endows a hospital or public building it usually carries his name, which is as it should be," Guest explains. "But most of us cannot do that sort of thing alone. We can do it,

however, if we all pull together." "Detroit has become one of the great cities of the world because hundreds of thousands of us little guys have learned how to pull together. So it is proper that a monument to honor Detroit's first 250 years should come from everybody on the Detroit team."

"NONE OF US CAN have a building named after us but we can have our names on record in the very cornerstones of these two buildings to show some future generation of Detroiters that the members of this generation did things as a team and in a big way."

Frederick C. Matthaei, Chairman of the Capital Gifts Committee, has emphasized that it was

never expected that subscriptions from business and industry would provide the entire \$5,500,000 needed to assure construction of the buildings.

"We selected these projects" Matthaei said, "because they will provide education, recreation and entertainment to everybody in this part of Michigan. We hope that everybody will join Eddie Guest and come in for a share of the credit when these two fine buildings are presented to the city."

The \$5,500,000 goal of the Capital Gifts Committee represents one-half of the construction costs. The other \$5,500,000 is being provided by municipal authorities from current revenues and savings. The land for both sites has been placed under condemnation.

Troy to Consider Rezoning of Land Adjacent to City
Rezoning of a 4.4 acre piece of property adjacent to the city of Birmingham will be considered by the Troy Township zoning commission, Tuesday evening, Aug. 7 at 7:30 at the township hall.

This week Clifford Truesdell, township clerk, notified the city commission that Rodney Lockwood and Otto and Edith Beier had applied for the property to be rezoned from agricultural to industrial use.

PROPERTY LIES north and adjoins the north line of Clover Hill Park cemetery and westerly of and also adjoins the westerly line of the Grand Trunk railroad right-of-way.

The applicants stated that land in the surrounding area is zoned industrial use, and this property, while zoned agricultural, is impractical for that use.

Truesdell stated he notified Birmingham officials, because the property is adjacent to the city.
