CLIFFORD M. DUNN

Named District Manager for General Electric

Clifford M. Dunn, 1666 Birmingham boulevard, has been appointed manager of General Electric Company's Michigan Apparatus district. The appointment, effective Aug. 1, was announced in Schenectady, N.Y. by Horace Zimmer, manager of field sales for the firm's Apparatus Marketing division.

As district manager, Dunn succeeds Arthur R. Hines, 966 Glenhurst, who has been appointed assistant manager of marketing for the company. Dunn's headquarters will be in Detroit, and the district comprises most of the state of Michigan.

BORN IN WICHITA, KAN. Dunn is a graduate of Washington University, St. Louis, where he received a degree in electrical engineering. He has been a General Electric Sales representative in the midwest since 1932.

He served as resident sales representative in South Bend, Ind., from 1932 until his appointment in 1945 as a sales engineer in G.E.'s Detroit office. He was appointed assistant manager of the office in 1948, and was named assistant manager of the Michigan district a year later.

Just as teachers and parents sometimes wonder where all the youngsters are going to be put, teachers have their own problem about where they will be put.

Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, superintendent of schools, said this week that living quarters are badly needed for this year's teachers.

"It is a simple fact," he said, "that the pleasantness of one's home life has a very important bearing on his mental attitude toward his work. Teachers are no exception."

"It is particularly important that they be happy and enjoy their work. In turn, they will be more pleasant with children and the whole atmosphere of the school is improved. As a result, there will be more effective learning on the part of the children."

Dr. Ireland is asking that anyone having a room or an apartment, within the price range of a teacher's salary, contact the board of education with the information.

"Miss DeBose, secretary in my office, will make a listing of all such rooms and apartments and make them available to incoming teachers," he said.
