Troy Schools Hire Five New Teachers; Enrollment Sept. 5

Troy township school board has approved the hiring of five new faculty members, including a principal of the newly completed high school.

Richard Drager, former principal of Eastland High school, Roseville, was named to replace Charles Dove as Troy high school principal. A graduate of Adrian college, Drager has been a teacher and principal since 1933, with the exception of three years of military service during the last war.

RAYMOND C. SHULTZ was approved as music instructor for Troy schools. He succeeds Gordon Mathie, who resigned. Shultz has been assistant band director at River Rouge.

Mrs. Dorothy Perry, who holds an AB degree from Wayne university, will instruct literature and history. New English instructor will be Mary Lee Andrew, who has an MA degree from the University of Michigan.

Wallace Rigotti has been hired to teach industrial arts, replacing Robert Menghini, who resigned.

IN OTHER BUSINESS at last week's board meeting, the Log Cabin high school athletic field was sold to D. B. A. Brown, builders, for \$14,025. This money will be used to develop the new high school football field.

School superintendent Stuart T. Baker stated that schools will open Tuesday, Sept. 4, when the pre-school conference for teachers is scheduled. Students will enroll Wednesday, Sept. 5.

Employs Less Than Nat'l Average

NEW YORK, Aug. 17.—In proportion to its population, Birmingham has fewer people in municipal employ than have most cities in the country. This is shown by the U.S. Department of Commerce following a survey of 1,228 cities with populations greater than 10,000.

On the municipal payroll in Birmingham, as of the beginning of the year, were 145 full-time employees, exclusive of teachers and other school workers.

This was equivalent to 2.7 employees for every 1,000 local residents and was under the average found in the other cities, 10.8 employed per 1,000 population.

THE PAYROLL in Birmingham

for this full-time staff amounted to \$42,200 per month. It represented a smaller tax load, in proportion to population, than was borne in most other cities for the purpose.

Divided by the population of Birmingham, the payroll amounted to an assessment of \$2.81 a month for each resident of the city.

Nationally, the per capita cost of meeting municipal non-school payrolls was \$2.87 a month. Among cities of less than \$30,000, the cost averaged \$1.98 per capita.

Wages received by Birmingham employees, taking into account all except school personnel, were higher than in most other communities.

Approved Treasurer's Report on Special Assessment Collections and waived penalty on 1951 installments to October 1st.

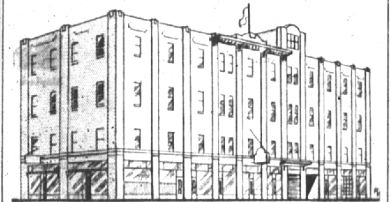
