

Former Pupils Of Prof. E. F. Waldo To Remember Him On 90th Birthday

One of Birmingham's early educational leaders will celebrate his 90th birthday on Sept. 15. Members of his classes are invited to join a birthday card shower for Prof. E. F. Waldo, who served as superintendent of schools from 1893 through 1902.

Edwin Waldo succeeded C. R. Fox as head of the community's educational system and, in June 1894, nine young people were graduated from Hill school under his direction.

Among that group was Miss Ella B. Adams, 163 Oakland, who is asking for members of his classes to remember Prof. Waldo on his birthday.

"Those attending Hill school during his reign will remember Professor Waldo," said Miss Adams. They will remember his splendid work with the youth of Birmingham as well as the influence he has left.
