Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, superintendent of schools, said parents whose children are entering school for the first time in Birmingham, may enroll the child week days between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. at the school he will attend. This does not, he pointed out, include those children who were registered during the Kindergarten Round-up last spring, however.
