



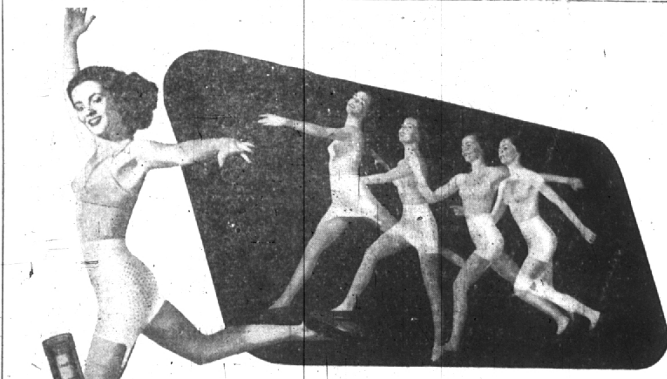

'Toby' Maxwell Earns Scholastic Honor at College

Princeton university has recently announced the awarding of the Stanley J. Edwin scholarship to Charles Thorburn (Toby) Maxwell, II, son of Mrs. C. Thoburn Maxwell of Wing Lake.

Maxwell, majoring in political science, is in his junior year at Princeton. He received a \$100 scholarship to the university upon his graduation from Cranbrook in 1946. The Edwin award, given for excellence in scholarship and athletics, totals \$1,000.

At present Maxwell, who is emphasizing the Latin American countries in his college major, is touring South America. He has already visited Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia and Ecuador and is at present in Peru.

DURING HIS visits to these places, Maxwell has been the guest of industrial and political leaders of the areas. He will later visit the archeological centers of Cuzco and Machu Picchu in Peru. After a trip to view tin mining operations in Bolivia, Maxwell will have a raft constructed for him and, with a crew of Indians, travel down-river to Iquitos, Peruvian port of the Amazon. From there he will travel by commercial river boat to Manaus and Belém in Brazil, a trip of more than 3,000 miles.

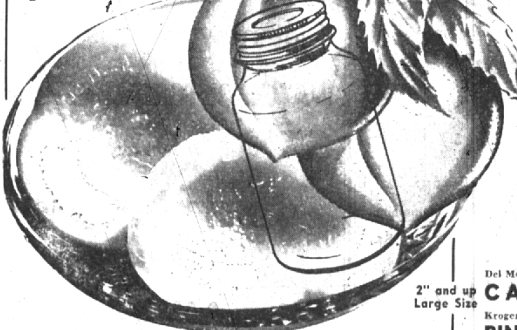
