When the 250 mile race at the State Fair track, sponsored by the National Association of Stock Car auto racing, is held Sunday, Aug. 12, a local car and driver will be entered and competing for a share of the \$12,500 in prize money.

W. A. Caltrider, 912 S. Woodward, is owner of a new Plymouth stock car. Number of the vehicle which is 34, is symbolized because that is the length of years Caltrider has been married.

DRIVER IS Jack Goodwin, 5808 Putnam drive, Walnut Lake, one of the outstanding racing drivers in this area.

Goodwin, a former Birmingham high school athlete, has been racing for the past four years and besides his weekly appearances at the Motor City Speedway, has competed in events in Ohio, South and North Carolina, Florida and Pennsylvania.

In the weekly hardtop races at Detroit this year, Goodwin has two firsts, five seconds and 10 thirds. Qualification trials are being conducted this week and the 50 fastest cars will be in the race Sunday.

All stock cars entered are either 1950 or 1951 models and are practically the same as ordinary automobiles. Nothing mechanical can be altered. However, rear cushions and floor mats can be discarded for the races.

ONLY MAIN DIFFERENCE between stock cars and regular autos are that tires designed for racing are used.

Caltrider's car is grey with bright red trimmings. It has been on display at the Caltrider sales rooms for the past week.

The 250 mile race will be the second longest stock car event staged by the NASCAR this year. It is being presented as part of the special events for Detroit's 250th anniversary.

Among the top racing drivers entered are Marshall Teague, Foxy and Tim Flock, Bill Holland, Herbert Thomas and Lee Petty.

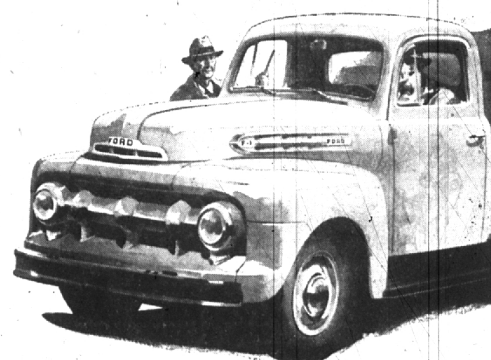
