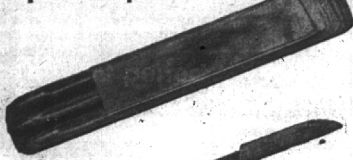

**District Given \$4,582 Credit On Reassessment**

A total credit of \$4,582.95 has been allowed by the city commission against a proposed reassessment of \$19,500 on the Birmingham Estates subdivision.

The district, since 1947, had paid in \$34,556.86 plus interest for asphaltic concrete surfacing and curb work which city records now show cost \$34,556.56. Commissioners accepted a committee report which recommended credit be allowed the district of \$682.01 on engineering charges, \$334.32 on equipment rentals, and \$1,566.60 on gravel originally removed from the subdivision's streets.
