Helen Rounds will come from New York Saturday to spend Christmas with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. George M. Rounds of Dewey road.

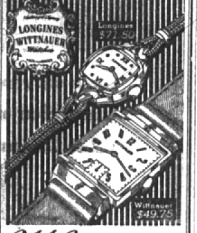

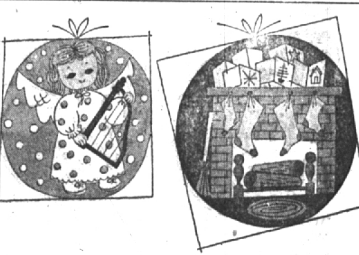

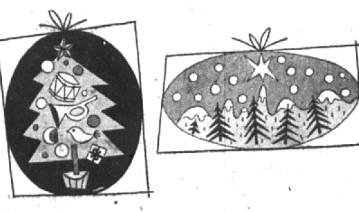
