

To Negotiate For 14 Mile Traffic Light

City Manager Donald C. Egbert was authorized by the city commission Monday evening to negotiate with the proper authorities for the installation of a traffic signal at the Pierce-14 Mile road intersection.

Before further action is taken, he will report back to the commission on the progress of his efforts.

Fourteen Mile road is under the jurisdiction of the county road commission, and a previous request by the United Brethren in Christ church for a signal was referred by the city to the county.

EGBERT SAID, "It would appear that the responsibility for this traffic light installation rests 50% with the county and 25% each with the city of Birmingham and Southfield township."

The Birmingham school board has agreed to pay for one-third of the cost of installation providing the county will maintain the light and the city of Birmingham and Southfield township will participate by each paying one-third.

Several weeks ago, a group of 14 Mile road residents appeared at a Southfield township board meeting and appealed for a traffic light at the intersection. The board later agreed to participate in paying one-third of the cost if the other units also contributed. Estimated cost of the light is \$750.

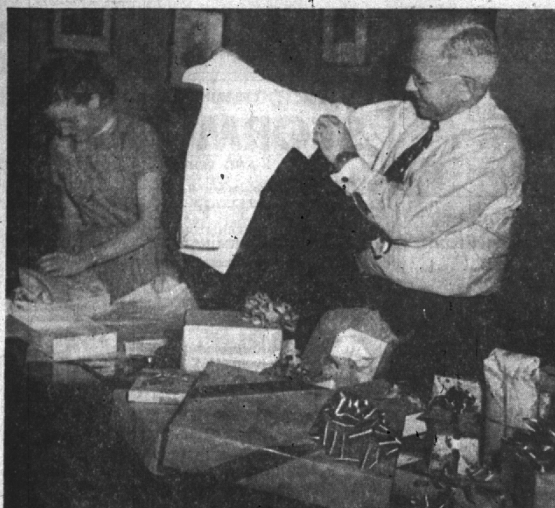

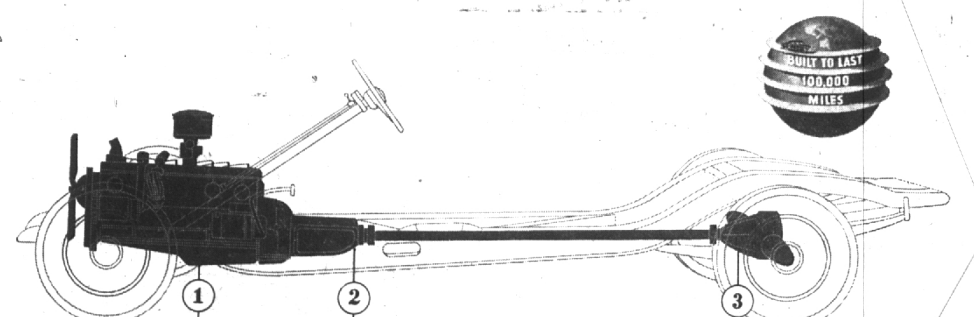
