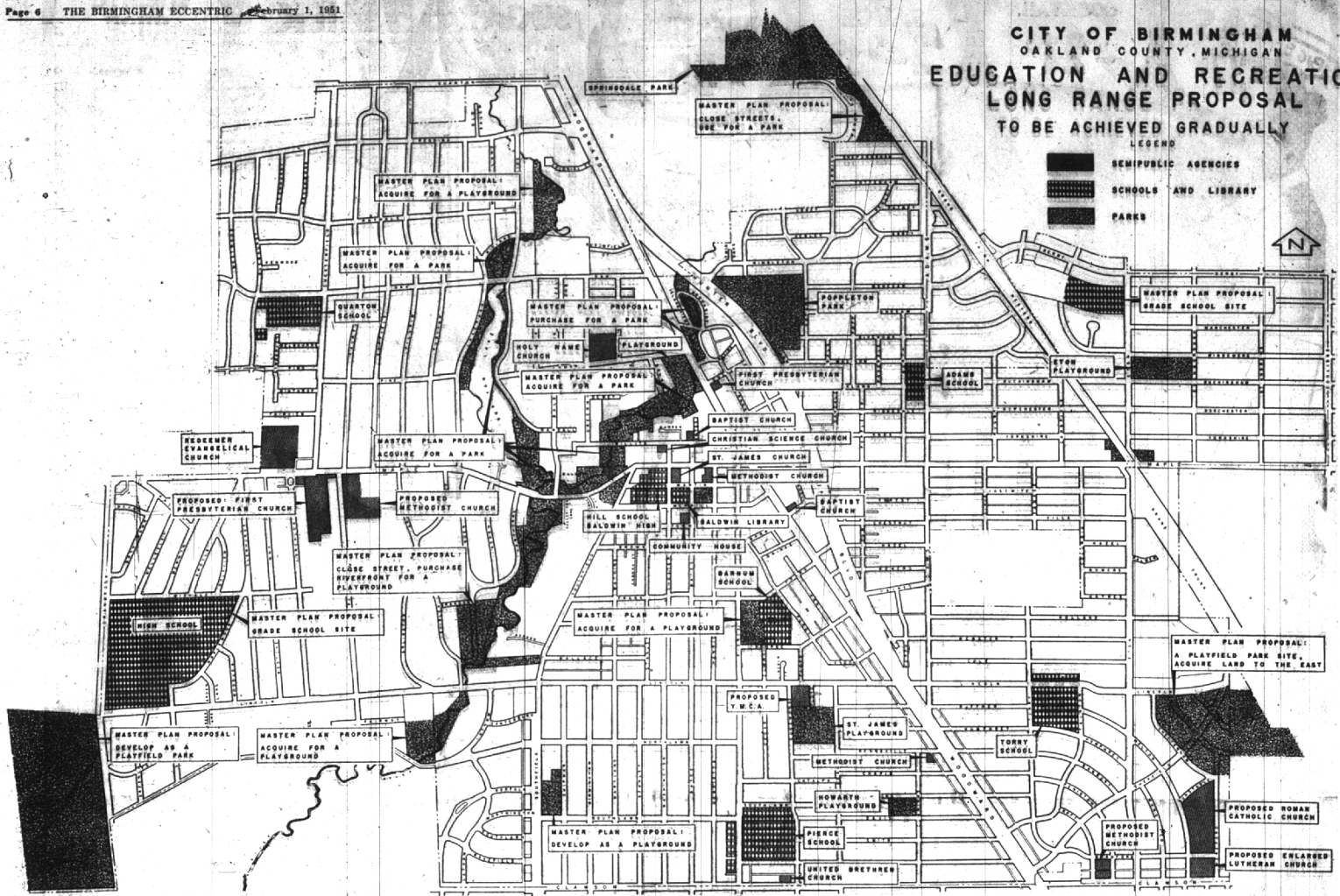

 Plan proposes three locations for future development as playgrounds:

1. NORTH SIDE of Northlawn Drive west of the present city owned property.
2. South of Brandon extending west from the river. With quiet its first defeat by the close score of 43 to 42.
3. North of Midland behind the residences on the east side of the present city property and the river, it would be possible to develop a very good playground.

These playground areas, together with the present city owned properties at Harmon and Woodward Park, St. James Park, Howard Park, the area at Southfield and Southlawn, and the Park would offer a well-rounded system of recreation points for the entire city.

THE PROPOSED master plan also provides for some larger recreation areas, referred to as playground areas.

As Barr explains, "These extensive areas for large group activities, adult games and family outings. Fortunately, Birmingham can provide such parks at strategic locations in the southwest, southeast and northeast sections by developing and expanding city-owned properties."
