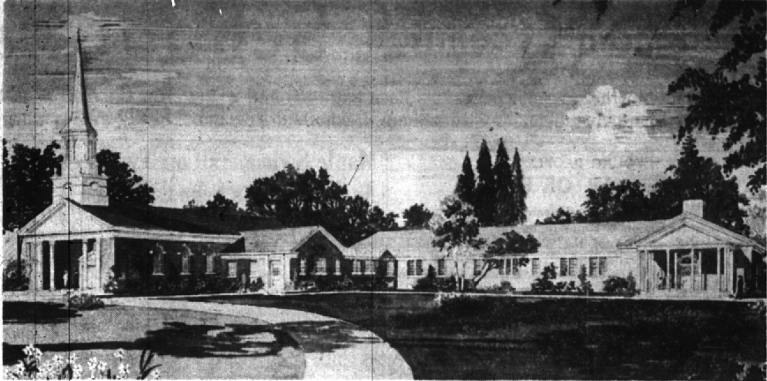

Lutheran Church's Proposed Educational Building



This architect's drawing shows the present church edifice (at left) and the proposed educational building of the Redeemer Lutheran church on West Maple, located at the rear and east of the present building. Work on the building will be started as soon as conditions permit. It will contain nine Sunday school

rooms, three assembly rooms, and offices for the minister and Sunday school secretary. The addition will be 115 by 40 feet and the estimated \$150,000 building cost will include driveways and parking areas.

Cranbrook Presents Two New Exhibitions

February exhibitions at the museum of the Cranbrook Academy of Art include "Designs for the International Competition for Low Cost Furniture" and a Michigan Artists' Work in Progress show.

The original designs for prize winning furniture in the international competition, recently sponsored by the Museum of Modern Art and Museum of Design project, Inc., will be displayed Feb. 2 to 28.

Cowinner of first prize in seating units was a chair designed by a former Cranbrook academy of art student, Don Knorr, of San Francisco. The chair is light and flexible and develops one of the

most ingenious structural schemes seen in modern furniture today. Theodore Luderovsk, instructor in design at Cranbrook, received an honorable mention in this group.

The Michigan Artists' show features textiles by Carl Strobe and Sonya Leach; pottery by Murray Douglas, Robert Diebold and J. T. Abernathy and metalwork by Marion and Fred Eagen, Clara and Allen Grey and Michael Vizini.
