Building Inspector**

A new building inspector was appointed by the Southfield township board Tuesday evening.

He is Clarence Laidlaw, a graduate civil engineer, who will receive \$5,000 a year, and \$50 a month car allowance. He plans to move to the township in the near future.

**THE NEW BUILDING** inspector, who will start immediately, has worked for several federal agencies in this capacity and recently was a building inspector for the Veteran's administration.

Last Saturday afternoon, members of the township board met as a committee of the whole to hear and discuss confidential reports they had obtained on the applicants who had been screened by a sub-committee.

Supervisor D. P. Frame said that no decision was made or action taken then because this session was not a special township board meeting.

**Nearly 7,000 City  
Autos Still Need  
1951 License Tags**

Nearly 7,000 new 1951 license plates still must be issued to Birmingham motorists, figures Charles Mortensen, secretary of the Birmingham Chamber of Commerce office. He said only 4,000 plates had been issued to date.

"The time is very nearly over for license purchases," he said. "Many local motorists are pressing the deadline."

Anticipating the last minute rush, the office will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. each day except Sunday until the end of the month. Mortensen asks that as many as possible purchase during the week so those who are working can be sure of getting their plates on Saturdays.

Motorists are reminded that they must have their title of ownership in order to get the new plates. Commercial vehicle owners must bring, in addition to the title, last year's registration or a weight slip.

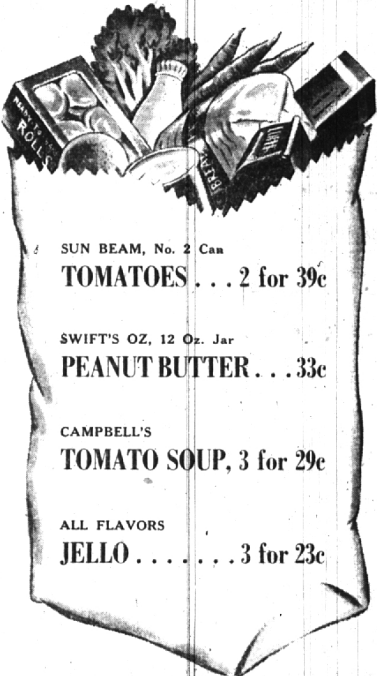
