to speak to these issues. However, Thomas Reid is to be commended for expressing something of this larger view.

"In ancient Israel the prophets laid down moral principles to guide their nation. They were ignored and their nations passed into history.

"In a later time a very wise man wept as he said, "If you yourself only knew today the conditions of peace!" Their capital city was laid waste and the people were dispersed to the ends of the earth when they chose to ignore them.

"WE MUST NOW heed the modern successors of the prophets or ignore them at our peril. We must accept their call to creative action.

"We do not need to be pacifists, or even Christians to understand that those who take (or depend upon) the sword shall (ultimately) perish." We must go beyond the realm of expediency to the realm of ultimate moral principles.

"We must, for example, go beyond discerning a nation for all history and then shortly demand that it return. We must beware of false pride.

"At no time do I recall the panel suggesting that we may need to re-adjust our own thinking. Apart from Mr. Reid, I recall little which suggested that we must do more for world peace than to isolate Russia.

"NOR MAY WE assume the things I have mentioned. They are the issues that must be spoken to in the "great debate." I am thankful for what has been done.

"But I would issue a challenge to a consecrated search for a "broad floor of common agreement" on the ultimate conditions of peace and brotherhood," Rev. Becker concluded.
