

Ferndale Cagers Outplay Maples

A fast moving, sharp shooting Ferndale quintet overpowered Birmingham 49-36 to rack up its second win over the Maples this season, in a league game played on the Raisplitter's home floor Friday night.

Early in the first quarter the Maples showed a flaw which proved their downfall—inability of the sliding zone to stop long shot artists.
Unable to stop the Raisplitter's from scoring, the Maples, thrown into a panic, could do nothing on offense or defense. By the end of the first half, Ferndale held a 19-point lead over the confused locals, who were able to score only 11 points in the entire first half.

BEGINNING THE second half the Maroons switched from the zone to a front court pressing defense attempting to check the Raisplitter's.
Although Birmingham improved during the last half, it still looked far under par. On offense even easy shots were missed time and again.
High scorer for the Raisplitter's was Tom Walker with 14 points. Birmingham center and forward Harry Walsh, who scored 35 points against East Detroit last week, led Birmingham with 12 markers.
