A double funeral was held from the Bell funeral home Monday afternoon for Mrs. Ida Golden, 666-11/2 N. 1st St., and John Charles Murphy, 60, both of 1074 Floyd street. Burial was in Rose Lawn cemetery.

Mr. Murphy died Jan. 4 in the Oakland county tuberculosis sanatorium after a long illness. He was born in London, Ont., on May 4, 1890 and received his education in the public schools there.

On Nov. 20, 1915, he married Marian E. Golden in Detroit and had lived in Birmingham since that time. Until illness forced him to retire he had operated a gas service station. He was a member of the First Presbyterian church.

Mr. Murphy is survived by his widow; a son, John F. of Birmingham; two daughters, Miss Eleanor Zook of Royal Oak and five grandchildren.

MRS. GOLDEN died Saturday morning in the Kitch Haven hospital in Flint. She was a long-time resident of this area; she was born May 4, 1870 in Bloomfield township. She was married to James F. Golden on June 17, 1890 and was also a member of the First Presbyterian church.

Besides her daughter, Mrs. Murphy, she is survived by a son, Mrs. S. Golden of Flint, six grandchildren and nine great grandchildren. The funeral of Mr. Murphy, Robert McKee, owner of McKee's station said:

"I had known 'Murphy' for a long time and had known him for years, but he's always been planning the future and has many business associates are going to miss him."
