Michigan's final revised report was submitted to the city commission where it is today.

Although the off-street parking project had been presented some months before to an informal meeting in the City Hall by the Hogan special committee, the contents were not brought to the attention of many local people.

Three off-street parking lots are included in the project. One of them is an area bounded by Brown, and Merrill, Estimated cost, as of Nov. 1, 1950, totaled \$49,000, excluding interest charges.
