Animal Welfare Society Returns 2,046 Dogs

Total of 2,046 dogs were either rehabilitated and placed in new homes or returned to their owners by the Oakland county animal welfare society during 1950, according to the annual report prepared by Robert Connor, 482 Westwood, president of the society.

This figure is 32% of the total dogs received which was 6,426. Connor said the president of the Michigan Humane society has reported that record as one of the best in the country for any similar society.

He added, "Every effort will be made to better the wonderful record of 1950. This society deserves the cooperation and support of all humane minded people of Birmingham and Oakland county."

The society's shelter is at 1100 East Walton boulevard, Pontiac.

Builder Suggests Southfield Revise Building Code

Rodney Lockwood, a builder of homes in Southfield township, appeared at the township board meeting last week and suggested a change in the building code.

He pointed out that the ordinance now provides that when a home is equipped with a detached garage, fireproofing in the form of 1/2 inch of cement plaster on metal lath must be provided. This material has a fire rating of 30 minutes.

LOCKWOOD SAID a one-half inch gypsum board barrier between the house and garage has a 40-minute rating. He pointed out that he would use two thicknesses of the board which would provide a 55-minute rating.

Lockwood stated that the township should change its code to specify any material which has at least a 30-minute rating.

The board said that his recommendations will be given consideration. The fire ratings which Lockwood quoted were taken from United States Bureau of Standards figures.
