Violinist, Ricardo Odoposoff To Be Next Community Concert Artist

Ricardo Odoposoff, violinist who made his New York debut in 1944, will be the third artist to be presented in the 1950-51 season by the Community Concert Association of Southern Oakland County.

This concert will be held Friday evening, February 2, at 8:15 p.m. in the Royal Oak High school auditorium.

Odoposoff can't remember a time when he wasn't playing his violin because he began with a quarter-size instrument at the age when most children plays with dolls or blocks. At five, he gave his first concert in his native Buenos Aires.

STUDYING IN ARGENTINA with a pupil of Leopold Auer, the youngster gave a concert every year until, at the age of twelve, he was taken from Buenos Aires to Berlin where he started under

the tutelage of the master teacher, Carl Flesch.

While still a student, he received the unprecedented honor of being chosen as soloist of the Berlin Philharmonic by conductor Erich Kleiber, a recognition never before accorded a not-yet-graduated artist.

IN 1932 RICARDO ODOPOSOFF won first prize in the International Contest at Vienna, then returned for a tour of his native continent. Europe recalled him and held him for many years. In 1937 he won the violinist's highest award—state prize in the Brussels Concours International Eugene Ysaÿe.

His record of orchestral engagements includes performances with 44 symphonic organizations under the leadership of 44 distinguished conductors. In February, 1944, the North American public finally had an opportunity to hear this musician.

AT HIS AMERICAN DEBUT in Carnegie Hall, he was hailed by the New York Times as "One of the outstanding violinists of the day." Since then a guide to excellence throughout the United States and Canada have had the opportunity to confirm that judgment for themselves. Now each year is divided equally between North America, South America and Europe.

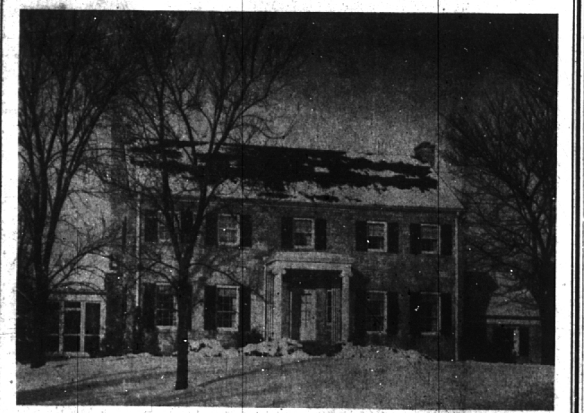

All guests of club members are welcome to attend this meeting and admission will be floral Valentine, for which prizes will be given.

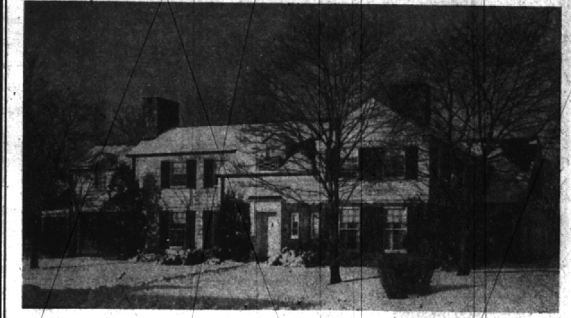
MRS. MYRTLE LABBIT, speaker for the afternoon, will present as her topic, "A Sweden

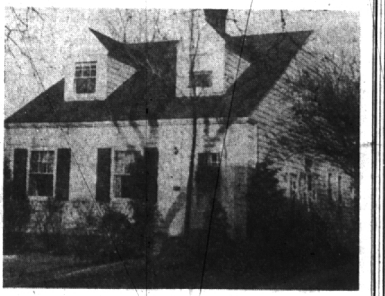

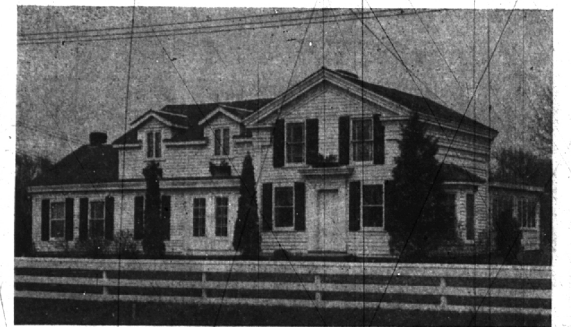
