The Robert Faverty, erstwhile residents of the Lahser road area, sailed on the Queen Mary last Saturday.

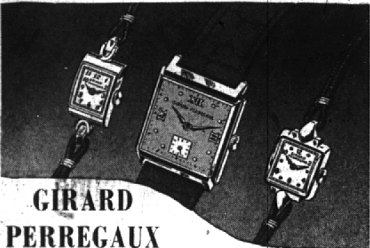

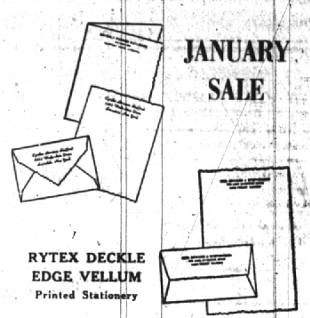
Christian Science Discussion Meetings
