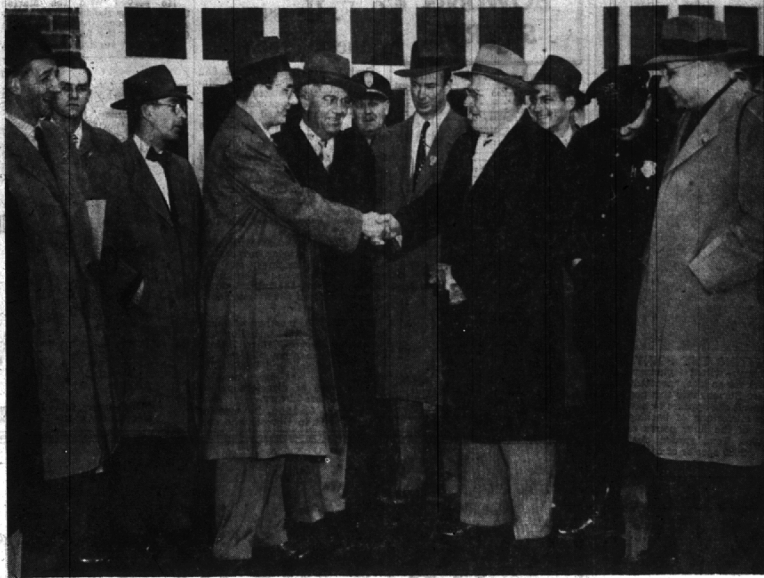

**Lerchen Home In Bloomfield Village Damaged By Fire**

A blaze caused from a pipe leading to the furnace resulted in a fire at the home of William Lerchen, Jr., 950 Waddington road, Bloomfield Village at 3:15 p.m. Monday.

The call was the first for the Bloomfield Village volunteer fire department since the dedication of its new fire hall Saturday.

Besides the village department, two trucks were called from Bloomfield township, and one from Bloomfield Hills. When firemen found a frozen fire hydrant, the Birmingham department was called to stretch lines to the fire.

**BLOOMFIELD VILLAGE** Fire Chief Charles Wiggins said that the damaged parts of the house were the furnace room, heat ducts, parts of the living room and a closet in the master bedroom. In addition a wall had to be opened at the stairway.

Firemen were hampered in fighting the blaze because the air ducts in the house kept the flames shooting throughout.

A nurse at the house, Mrs. Stella Edgar, 247 Oakland, turned in the alarm and escaped with four children in the home.

Water was provided by a tank truck from the Bloomfield township department and finally the village firemen were able to connect a line to a fire hydrant on Westwood.

Wiggins said that all hydrants in the village were checked Tuesday and the department is now investigating the best means to keep them from freezing in the future.

The counter offer will present one large lot at Woodward and Bloomfield Court.

**City Contingent Fund To Receive Excess Of Tax Rolls, Fees**

In the future, the excess of the roll from the city, school and county taxes, and all monies received as a result of the 4% penalty added to county and school taxes, will be credited to the city's contingent fund. This will be done as a result of an opinion by City Attorney Forbes S. Hascall. In the past these amounts have been credited to the general fund, but the law requires they go to the contingent fund, Hascall said.
