Robert S. Drews, M.S., M.D., Dr. P.H., a practicing psychiatrist in Detroit and professional lecturer on mental hygiene, will address the Birmingham Teachers' club next Monday, January 8, at 3:45 p.m. in Baldwin High school. Dr. Drews' topic for the afternoon will be, "What Is A Teacher?" He has recently returned from a three-and-a-half month tour of England and the Continent. An independent survey of mental health conditions was made by Dr. Drews and he was recently interviewed in Paris by the Associated Press, regarding mental health and political leadership. While in Sorbonne, Paris, the doctor also attended scientific meetings of the World Federation of Mental Health, the International Congress of Criminology and the International Congress of Psychiatry.

Hearing on Rent Controls in Hills Set for Tuesday

To Address Public Meeting January 11

Dr. Russell Hunt Einfeld, associate professor of political science at the University of Michigan, will speak at a public meeting of the American Association of University Women, on Thursday, January 11, at 8 p.m. in the Birmingham Community House. A specialist in international relations with eastern countries, his topic will be, "Recent Trends in The Far East." The public is urged to hear Dr. Einfeld, with a special invitation to high school students and anyone interested in current developments in international relations.

DR. FIFIELD, a history and government major, was graduated, cum laude, from Bates college in 1935 and earned his Ph.D. at Clark university in 1942. He taught at the University of Missouri and one semester at the National Wabag University at Wuchang, China. He spent a year in the division of research and publications of the Department of State, working on far eastern aspects of "Papers relating to foreign relations of the United States."

SINCE DR. FIFIELD is at the State on an assignment for the State Department, there will be no question and answer period following his lecture. After the meeting there will be a coffee hour for AAUW members and their escorts.
