

Commission Approves City Park Regulations

Regulations for the use of city parks and playgrounds, as submitted by Recreation Director Frank Whitney, were approved by the city commission Monday evening.

GENERAL POLICY

The playgrounds, parks, community centers and other recreational facilities are established by law for public recreation purposes. The public recreation program consists primarily of activities planned and directed by the recreation board, and, secondarily of recreation activities of organized groups brought under the control of the recreation board when conducted under permit at the public playgrounds and parks.

PERMITS

Permits without charge may be granted by the recreation board to local community groups to meet or conduct activities on city property used by the recreation board provided the area or areas are not otherwise required by the board and the activities are: (1) conducted in accordance with board standards; (2) held without admission charge; (3) not conducted for private monetary gain.

A limited number of recurrent revocable permits may be issued if facilities are available. If for any proposed event a community group desires to depart from any of the conditions mentioned above, such for example, as to charge admission for a special event, then application must be made for a special permit for that event.

FEES

Groups which do not meet all requirements set forth in the last ruling, may be granted special permits by the recreation board but will be charged a fee which will be determined by the board.

METHOD OF MAKING APPLICATION

Application for use of an area by any group should be submitted in writing to the Birmingham recreation board at least 10 days before the date of requested use. Application forms may be secured through the recreation office.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING USE OF AREAS

No activities shall be conducted causing extra caretaker work or exceptional maintenance unless previous agreement has been made to pay for such extra work. Activities shall normally cease at 10 p.m. unless otherwise stated in the permit. Adults must be present throughout any function involving children.

Children. Permits will not be issued for an assembly of minors.

No alcoholic beverages may be brought into any of the public areas.

No picnics are allowed in any recreational areas except under the jurisdiction of the recreation board.

(More than a year ago the city commission by resolution restricted use of city parks to Birmingham residents.)

Claims Too Many Trucks Using Adams

The Elm-Maple-Adams truck traffic problem appeared again before the city commission Monday evening, this time as the result of a letter from Mrs. C. F. Charlton, 119 S. Adams, who pointed out that the opening of Elm from Maple to 14 Mile apparently hasn't done much to alleviate the traffic along Adams.

Only last week a delegation from Elm appeared before the commission to ask that immediate steps be taken to safeguard children and private cars along that street.

THEY CHARGED that big semi-trailer trucks are speeding considerably over the 25 mph limit.

Mayor Chad Ritchie revealed Monday night that considerable Elm truck traffic appears to be carrying material back and forth to Bates street which is being paved, and is a temporary problem. He volunteered to write Mrs. Charlton and explain the city's attempts to control traffic over these particular streets.

Miller Shoe Store Awaiting Catches Fire

A cigaret is believed to have been tossed at the awning of the Miller Shoe Store, Woodward and Maple, at 3:30 Friday afternoon, resulting in the sounding of a general alarm. Fire was confined to the awning and immediately extinguished.
