Oakland Hills Course Regains Appearance

On Sunday, June 17, majestic Oakland Hills golf course offered a discouraging sight to Greenkeeper Forest Acton. Acton stated this week, "On that morning, which was the day after the National Open concluded, I stood at number one tee, looked around the course and felt like crying. Those once nice green fairways were trampled down, and all I could see were bottles lying around the course."

He said his crew was kept busy picking up bottles and smashed glass, for several days and even now, some are found daily on various parts of the course.
HOWEVER, WORK was started immediately on fixing the course up, and now Acton reports it is looking better each day. The ways are being constantly mowed and watered and it won't be long before the course regains its former natty appearance.

No plans are being made at present for any major revisions of the course, although some may be done this fall.
Acton said that golfers report the greens are faster than they were before the tournament. The greenkeeper also added that he observes the members are shooting just as good golf as they did before the major revisions were made.

He concluded, "It's nice to have a National Open at your course, but once every 10 years or so is enough. It took 10 months of hard work right up to the time of the tournament to get the course ready, and I wouldn't want to go through that again for several more years."

Requests Extension Of Lincoln Paving

Birmingham area professionals couldn't quite cope with the sizzling Ed Furgol tournament-wise pro from Royal Oak, in the Michigan PGA tournament at Indianwood Sunday.

Ed fashioned a respectable 71 in his morning round and came roaring back in the afternoon with a sensational 66. This was accomplished over the difficult Indianwood layout with a high wind making accuracy impossible.
Chic Harbert, Meadowbrook pro who has won the event four of the last five years, had to settle for second place money with rounds of 71-70 and Sam Byrd who birdied three and had an eagle in his last seven holes of his afternoon round, took third with 74-68.

WALLY BURKEMO finished fourth after leading the field with Max Evans at the end of the morning round. Each had 69 at that point, but neither could hold on.
Wally finished with a 74 and Max one stroke behind with a 75.
Evans fouled up on the middle hole where he hit a tremendous tee shot which hit the corner of the clubhouse and glanced off into the shrubbery behind the green. Two near unplayable lies caused him to take a six and he never made up the lost ground. Furgol in contrast drove the same green and ranned in a long putt for a duce.
