## Parents of Campers Offered Suggestions

Helpful advice to parents whose children are attending camps this summer and away from home for the first time was offered this week by Ed Kierbert, local Y secretary.

Kierbert said, "First of all, you should loosen your apron strings. Starting as it may seem, Johnny, for the first time on his own. Except for an occasional visit, letters will be your only means of communication with him."

"Unless you want to make him homesick on purpose, at all costs show letters of the 'We miss you terribly... be a brave little boy variety. If you accompany him to camp, don't complain about his Spartan-like features. Within the hearing of his camp-mates, don't baby him, don't tell him to take his vitamin tablets, or to wear his rubbers when it rains."

He added, "Kill the impulse to stage a long drawn out sentimental farewell. You may otherwise tag him irrevocably as a mama's boy."

"The Y official pointed out that parents shouldn't take seriously that first letter from the young camper stating that the food is rotten or camp-mates and counselors are all against him. Kierbert emphasized that any reputable camp serves a scientifically prepared diet adequate to any boy's needs."

He stated, "As for the point that the boy's companions and counselors are against him, forget it. They aren't. If Johnny is homesick, the best advice I can give is to leave him alone. Homesickness passes quickly and he will be a better lad for it."

"Of course, homesickness can become so intense that it is better for a child to go home. But the counselor can recognize this better than you can. Rely on him. Usually trained in child psychology, skilled in craft techniques, he assumes, to a great extent your parental prerogatives."
