Army, Air Force Extends Date of Enlistments

Men who have taken or received orders to take pre-induction physicals before Aug. 1, may still enlist voluntarily in the Army or Air Force, Major Harry G. Drapeau, deputy for recruiting, Michigan Military district, said today.

Regulations which prevented men from enlisting after receiving notice of pre-induction were first relaxed for 30 days between June 15 and July 15 and has now been extended to July 31.

Pre-inductees who wish to volunteer are asked to visit the local Army and Air Force recruiting station at the Birmingham Post Office.
