Considering New Ordinances For Troy Township

Possibility of establishing new ordinances for the regulation of topsoil removal in the township, and a new plumbing ordinance were discussed at Monday evening's Troy township board meeting.

A committee composed of Supervisor Norman R. Barnard, Clerk Clifton Truesdell and Engineer Edwin (Tex) Seavey appointed to draw up and present to the board an ordinance for regulation of topsoil removal.

BARNARD STATED that the township has had several requests in the past to remove soil, and the township engineer feels that it is possible to control removal. In some cases land has been left in bad condition. The supervisor emphasized that the ordinance would regulate the practice and not restrict it.

Oakland County Sanitarian Robert Coleman appeared at the session to discuss various township sanitation problems, particularly in the Addison Heights subdivision and adjacent to the Boyd street drain in Big Beaver.

He pointed out the county health department couldn't recommend a complete solution but suggested the township consider the possibility of adopting a code providing for plumbing inspections.

HE ALSO stated the township should check into sanitation facilities whenever subdivision plans are approved.

The board appointed a committee to investigate the possibility of adopting a plumbing code and report back at the Aug. 14 meeting. Named to this group were Truesdell, Cecil H. Mason and Henry Hering.

A resolution was received from the City of Ferndale asking the township to join in a program with other south Oakland County municipalities to have a preliminary survey concerning drainage problems.

The board believes that the money needed for such a survey, \$30,000 is too expensive. It decided to table the matter until more information can be received, and exactly how much the township's share would be.

Bill Torrence, this year's picnic chairman, said the club has decided not to presume on Baldwin's generosity any longer.

"The event has been moved to the Orchard Lake country club waterfront Aug. 27," he explained.

Golf, swimming and fishing in the afternoon will be followed by the customary steak dinner in the evening, he said.

Easement Granted

Owners of lot 130 in the Sheffield estates, a triangular section at the corner of Sheffield and Bradford, has granted the city an easement of six feet on each side of the water main which crosses their property. City Manager Donald C. Robert recommended the acceptance of the grant of easement and its recording with the county register of deeds.

Forest Paving Okayed

Special assessment district for construction of permanent pavement and sidewalks on Forest avenue between Brown and Hunter has been approved. The estimated cost of \$3,475, will be assessed against property owners in two payments. Construction is expected next year.

Polio Hysteria Is Main Concern Of Physicians

Hysteria of family and patient accompanying a case of polio in the physician's main concern, Dr. Frederick M. Adams told Birmingham Rotarians Monday noon.

"There are several other virus diseases that are more serious and crippling than polio, such as rheumatic fever, which families do not get particularly excited about," he emphasized.

Many more people have had polio and don't know it than those whose symptoms become evident, he stated.

"THE CASES you read about are exceptionally few, as far as medical records are concerned," he said.

He cautioned against over-excitation, particularly following a "summer cold."
