**Proposed Zoning Changes For Southfield Twp. to Be Discussed at Hearing**

A public hearing has been scheduled by the Southfield township zoning board for Thursday evening, July 26 at 8 p.m. in the Southfield 10 school to discuss proposed changes in the zoning ordinance.

Proposal would change all homes in the area bounded on the north by 13 Mile; east by Lahser; south by 12 Mile; and west by Telegraph from residential two to four zones. Also slated for change to residential five are all homes in the area from 14 Mile to 12 1/2 Mile and Inkster to Telegraph. Minimum cubic size of residential five zones are 20,000 feet.

Another proposed change in zoning is M. J. Murphy's Orchard Estates subdivision from residential two to three.

Contingent change in this ordinance also stipulates that there shall be a side yard for each lot, and minimum widths are established according to the residential classification.
