

City to Get Plans For Planting of West Maple Area.

Plans will be secured for the planting and beautification of the area north and west of the Maple bridge.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert told city commissioners Monday evening that the area surrounding Maple avenue between Southfield and west of the Rouge

should be a site of the greatest scenic beauty in the city and future plantings should be carefully planned.

He pointed out that the forestry and parks department has done considerable work in cleaning up the area. Bulldozing work preparatory to landscaping is scheduled this week.

Commissioners approved the bid for \$1,150 from Wilcox and Land to give consultation service and provide a plan.
