Aviation Cadet Takes Training On USS Monterey

PENSACOLA, Fla., June 4, 1961.—Naval Aviation Cadet J. R. Hughes, of the United States Navy took off and landed his SNJ "Teardrop" trainer six successful times aboard the USS MONTEREY, cruising in the Gulf of Mexico, to complete his aircraft carrier qualifications.

CADET HUGHES, son of Mrs. Grace Hughes, 511 Bates, graduated from Birmingham high school prior to enlisting in the Navy in September of 1948.

He reported to Pensacola, Fla., "The Annapolis of the Air" in May of 1960 and has completed a stringent schedule in military, academic, physical and flight training. From Pensacola he has been sent to advanced training at Corpus Christi, Tex. This will be a four month syllabus in combat type aircraft. Graduation from advanced training will win him the coveted Navy Wings of Gold.

GREAT LAKES, Illinois.—Three weeks of training are in store for Midshipman Roger G. Booth, USNA, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Booth, 1931 Grandfield, Birmingham, Mich., who, beginning Aug. 11, will participate in Operation "Capitol," a combination of amphibious training with aircraft carrier indoctrination and a series of continental air routes.

He will undergo the amphibious training at U. S. Naval Amphibious Base, Little Creek, Va., with other midshipman from the U. S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Md., and cadets from the U. S. Military Academy, West Point, N. Y.
