LEGAL NOTICES

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE LANDS OCCUPANCY OF STATE LANDS

ARTHUR K. MOORE, Judge of Probate 6-16-14-15

The Commission of Conservation by the Governor of the State of Michigan, in 1931, as amended, the following rules and regulations which shall be observed under the control of the Department of Conservation:

- It shall be unlawful:
 - To enclose any private state lands for any purpose when said lands are open to the public.
 - To camp for more than 15 days on any private state lands.
 - To authorize or leave boats unattended on any private state lands.
 - To have collected refuse and rubbish, including tin cans, bottles, and fish offal, or to deposit same in stream or lake. Garbage pits or other receptacles must be used where applicable.
 - To build a fire without proper provision for the control of the same.
 - To remove, destroy, mutilate, or deface any public monument, or other property of the Department of Conservation.
 - To post, place, or erect signs, to erect a fence or barrier, to construct or construct a building, or to occupy state lands, without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.
 - To use state lands for a commercial purpose without the written permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.
 - To graze state lands without the permission of an authorized representative of the Department of Conservation.
 - Those rules and regulations shall be in force and effect until May 1, 1951.
- Violation of any rule or failure to perform any of the duties herein shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100 and/or imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both, and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.
