"Our program this year will be just routine work," he said Monday. "Floors, woodwork and furniture will be cleaned and refinished. Repairs will be made where needed, but nothing definite is scheduled.

"Of course, our heating equipment will be gone over thoroughly as an 'insurance' check. By spotting minor weaknesses during the summer months, we are often able to prevent winter break-downs."

Order Roll Prepared For Forest Pavement

City Engineer L. R. Gare, told city commissioners Monday the estimated cost for the paving of Forest from Brownell to Hunter is \$3,475.

This will include an eight-inch concrete slab with separate straight curb and the replacement of 440 square feet of sidewalk on the south side of the street.

Commissioner, recognizing the necessity of the work, approved the project and ordered the final assessment roll to be prepared.

To Build Sidewalk On Washington Blvd.

Work will be started as soon as possible on a new sidewalk on the east side of Washington boulevard for a distance of approximately eight lots. Although abutting property owners objected, commissioners said pedestrian traffic indicated the need of a walk.

A resolution approving this work was passed in 1948. Commissioners explained that the project would have been completed, but it had been postponed to obtain a satisfactory contract.

Contract Approved By SOH Authority

The South Oakland Hospital authority Thursday evening approved a contract whereby the Oakland hospital board will take over its 13 Mile road site, cash and pledges it has collected already.


