Guest artists will be announced later, as will programs for Youth Concerts and Pop Concerts.

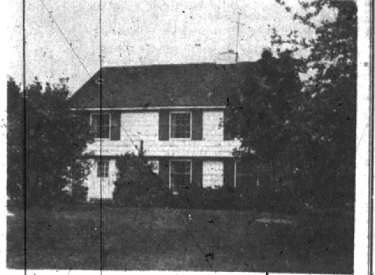

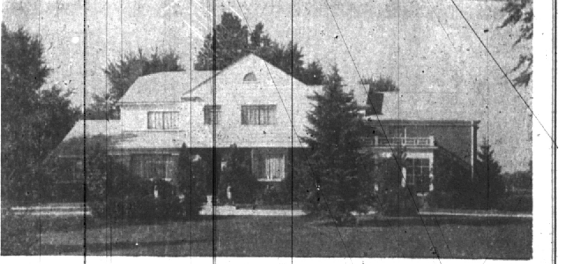
