**To Advertise for
Fire Hall Bids**

Bids will be advertised some time next week for construction of two new fire halls for Southfield Township, according to Supervisor William Roser.

The buildings will be located at 13 Mile road, between Evergreen and Southfield, and on the south end of Nine Mile, two blocks west of Telegraph road. Only five buildings in the township is on 10 Mile, one block east of Northwestern highway.

LAST FALL, township voters decided that two new fire halls be constructed by December, 1951. Roser also said that delivery of the township's new fire truck will be delayed until one of the halls is built, because at present there is no storage space for it. The American LaFrance fire engine was ordered last November at a total cost of \$29,726.62.

Architect for the project is Clarence A. Durbin, 19741 Sexton, Southfield township.
