In addition to his Eagle award, Explorer Scout Vela also received life-saving, scholarship and citizenship awards Monday evening.

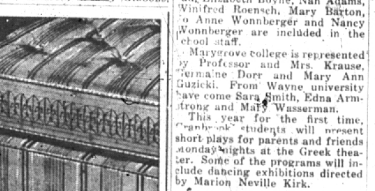
