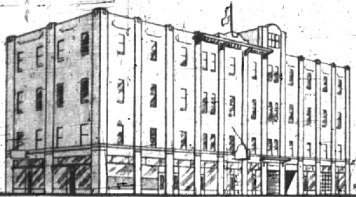

AAUW to Support Mrs. Sappington, B of E Candidate

AAUW directors this week pledged that organization's support to Mrs. Olga Sappington, candidate for re-election to the Birmingham board of education.

Speaking for the group, Mrs. Lawton Taylor said it was the policy of the national AAUW to support qualified women for public office and to maintain high educational standards in all communities.

"On this basis we heartily recommend the re-election of Mrs. Sappington to the board," Mrs. Taylor quoted directors as saying.

"The maintenance of high standards of education is written into the national charter of the organization.

"OUR CHARTER also reads that we should encourage women to assume their share of responsibility for the conduct of public affairs and to take practical steps to support qualified women for no-

pointment or election to office."
"This is certainly a case which merits our efforts. We feel Mrs. Sappington is highly qualified for this office and that in giving her our support, we are maintaining high standards in education."

"Moreover, her knowledge of, and participation in, civic affairs, and her valuable record and experience as a member of the local board of education give her qualifications over and above the average."
