New Town Hall In Southfield On April Ballot

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THE BOARD RECEIVED a letter from Justice Hugh C. White announcing his resignation from the board effective immediately.

No reason was given for the resignation.

White's term, which began in 1949, still has two years to run. His term will be filled by James Lovano, 28600 Tyler, who was appointed Tuesday by the board.

The new justice is a lawyer.

In other business, Stanley Pons, owner of Fong Trailer camp appeared and requested the board to drop its suit against him.

The township filed a suit against Pons last fall, requesting that he be restrained from expanding his trailer camp across Southfield road.

Pons stated, "The township should withdraw the case because I don't think it can win the case. I don't think I'll be put out of business. I'm there to stay."

Supervisor D. P. Frame said the request will be taken "under consideration."

Robert J. Quinn of Colonial court has announced the sale of the Manor-Wood Center to the Delamade Construction corporation of Detroit.

The \$300,000 shopping center's construction was begun about a year ago by the Winters company of Pontiac. Work was halted some months ago by construction difficulties, according to Mrs. Quinn. She added that the new owners planned to start work immediately on the completion of the building.

Rebates Approved From Water Main Assessment District

Rebates will be paid to private property owners and the water department from the special assessment roll for the Birmingham Villages Water mains. The city commission approved this action Monday evening.

Refunds to property owners will total \$945.73 and the water department will get \$244.04. A total of \$877.03 will go to the bond fund when sufficient additional cash accrues.

City Waives Claim To SDM License Fee

The city has waived any part of the SDM license fee in connection with the transfer from Royal Oak to Birmingham of a license for the new C. F. Smith Co. store on Hunter.

The city commission received a letter Monday evening from the Michigan Liquor Control commission, asking that it waive its claim to any part of the license fee for the current year. The letter stated that 85% of the license fee for 1950 has been returned to the city of Royal Oak.

Charles Shain Taken To Hospital Friday

Charles J. Shain, for over 40 years one of Birmingham's leading merchants, was taken to St. Joseph Mercy hospital in Pontiac Feb. 27 suffering from pneumonia.

A Wednesday morning report said his condition was "critical."

Shain suffered a heart attack in June, 1949, and was hospitalized for several months.

Southfield Twp. To Advertise for Fire Hall Bids

The Southfield township board voted Tuesday evening to advertise for bids for the construction of two fire halls in the township. The bids must be received at the township office before 8 p. m., March 27.

Last September, township voters provided that two fire halls should be constructed before December, 1951.

The purchase of two sites for the future construction of the halls has been authorized by the board during the past month. One site is west of Southfield and 18 Mile roads and the other is at the corner of 12 Mile and Dufry.

Although these sites have not been purchased yet, the deeds are being prepared.

Late-Comers Circle C-C Office to Beat Car Plate Deadline

Wednesday morning saw a line of late license buyers surrounding the Chamber of Commerce building on East Maple. Charles Mortenson, secretary, said plates were being sold at the rate of 1,000 per day as the deadline approached.
