**Motion Denied for
Temporary Injunction**

A motion that a temporary injunction be issued to restrain Mr. and Mrs. Irwin White from publishing a newspaper in their home at 26380 Wellington road, Franklin, was denied Monday morning in circuit court by Judge Frank L. Doty.
The bill of complaint was brought by Franklin residents who claim the Whites are violating a subdivision restriction. Mrs. White and Mrs. Betty Lewis are copublishers of the Four Corners Press. A hearing to decide whether a permanent injunction shouldn't be issued will be held at an early date, attorney for the plaintiffs said.

**Fons Trailer Camp
Case Still Undecided**

A date still hasn't been set for a hearing in Pontiac circuit court, for Stanley and Viola Fons to show cause why an injunction shouldn't be issued to restrain them from enlarging their trailer camp. Southfield township filed the suit last fall and requested that the Fons be restrained from expanding their camp west across Southfield road.
A hearing was held before Judge Frank Doty Jan. 23 and a motion to dismiss the case was denied.
