Troy Twp. Hunting Ban Question on April 2 Ballot

Troy township residents will have a chance at the April 2 election to vote whether or not hunting should be banned on the township for the next five years.


Both houses of the state legislature have passed an act to prohibit hunting, but a vote of the people is necessary before it can go into effect.

The township board requested Representative Howard Estes to initiate the bill before the legislature. Complaints have been received from residents about hunting taking place too near dwellings. In addition, some car windshields have been shattered and several cattle killed by pellets.
