

Dan Jewell Earns Reputation in Metropolitan Bowling Circles

A local bowler, Dan Jewell, 1253 Kirts, has been establishing a fine reputation for himself in bowling circles in the metropolitan area recently.

His most recent honors have been as a member of a doubles team with Bill LaRue of Detroit. The pair have won twice on the WXYZ-TV bowling program "Make It and Take It" held Monday evenings from the State Fair Recreation in Detroit.

THEY WERE RUNNERSUP in this tourney in 1948. Another title won by Jewell was the Pontiac individual championship in 1947.

Back in 1940, Danny was a member of a local squad called "Ladd's Service" which bowled the highest series ever made in Birmingham.

He has competed in five ABC tournaments and tries to take in

as many state meets as possible. Jewell said that the factor hindering his competing in more tournaments is the cost of traveling and the matter of taking time off from his job.

Jewell has been bowling for the past 18 years. He received his first experience as a pinboy in the old Birmingham alleys, which were then located in the basement of the building at 152 S. Woodward, formerly used by the State Liquor store.

At that time there were only three alleys and there was no league bowling.

JEWELL NOW BOWLS in the Class A Motor City league in Detroit. Until recently, he was a member of the All Star Classic. Both these leagues are the highest in the city and bowlers should have at least a 155 average to compete.

He also fills in quite often in the Birmingham Recreation house league. In the Motor City league, Jewell has a 197-198 average. His highest three game series since he

started bowling is 737 and his top single score, 278.

Jewell stated that competition and condition of the alleys are a big factor in the performance of a bowler. In addition, even the top bowlers in the country have their off nights just as the best baseball pitchers occasionally have an off-game, when nothing goes right.

THE LOCAL BOWLER said that his best advice to the beginner is "First, get your own ball and shoes, and then have someone straighten you out on your form. In addition, practice all you can." Jewell said that since he has appeared on the television show, he meets many strangers who tell him they saw him on TV. He pointed out that bowling before the television cameras isn't much different than bowling elsewhere, although the bright lights and heat make some difference. He stated that the pressure of bowling before so many persons hasn't affected his game.

Jewell is married, has two children and has lived in Birmingham most of his life.

ALONG WITH the medal he won last year for copping the Detroit doubles title, Jewell proudly carries in his pocket another medal he earned for winning a county grade school track event when he attended local schools.

Jewell is employed as a driver for Beck Cleaners.

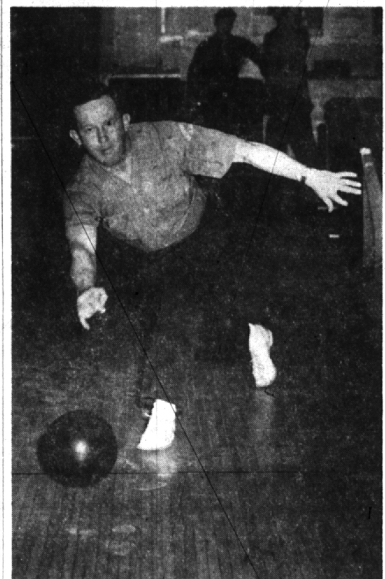

Fate of Bloomfield Twp. Caucus Hinges On April 2 Election

Bloomfield township voters will decide April 2 whether they wish to go back to the primary election to nominate township officers.

Petitions were presented to the township board Monday evening requesting the change, and it was voted to put the matter on the ballot. Supervisor David Anderson said the caucus has been used in Bloomfield since 1932. Previous to that time, primary elections were held.

When it was first started, there were only about 400 to 500 voters there, but now there are 1,800. Residents claim that a great deal of confusion is caused because of caucus nominations.

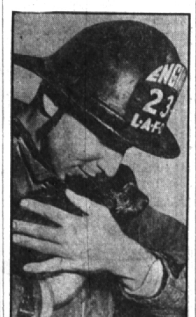
Three to Appear in Hills Court
